Andrew Morgan is the Legal Program Director for the Lex Mundi Pro Bono Foundation. Morgan joined the Foundation in 2016 and directs its key program connecting leading social entrepreneurs with Lex Mundi member firms to provide critical pro bono legal services.

Prior to joining the Foundation, Morgan served as Associate Corporate Counsel for International Medical Corps, a global humanitarian assistance NGO. In this role, he helped manage the legal affairs of the organization during a time of unparalleled humanitarian challenges including the Ebola crisis in West Africa and the Syrian refugee crisis.

Morgan received his J.D. degree from the University of Washington School of Law in 2014 and a Master of Public Service degree from the University of Arkansas Clinton School of Public Service in 2012. As a student, Morgan was an editor for the Pacific Rim Law & Policy Journal (now the Washington International Law Journal) and did legal work for Mercy Corps, the Public International Law & Policy Group, DLA Piper's international pro bono program and the Clinton Foundation. He has lived and volunteered in several countries including India, Nigeria, South Africa, and East Timor. Morgan started his career as an English language teacher in rural Japan where he lived for two years.

As a legal professional with experience in nonprofit and coalition building endeavors, Morgan is committed to the practice of law as a force for impactful social good and is particularly interested in the intersection of law and development, legal social innovation, and social entrepreneurship.
